Shared memories of May 4, 1970

"On May 4th, 1970, I...had a small son and wife -- pregnant wife at home, when I heard of the killings here at the university.... I was totally shocked, as was everybody else, on May 4th. I remember not being able to sleep nights after that, because of the helicopters and their lights. Helicopters went right over our house all the time -- and the lights. It was very -- a very disturbing time."

"... I was a student at Bowling Green University....
And students at Bowling Green struck their classes for
one week. They just -- we kind of -- the students closed
all classes down, in protest of what happened on May
4th... And it was a very, very moving experience, to
know that we could lend our support for what happened
at Kent State. And I, just, I will never ever forget that."

"I visited your campus this past summer on a rainy Sunday morning in late August . . . The memorial performed its purpose as far as I am concerned. It is inscribed 'inquire, learn, reflect'. I did just that . . . As we left Kent, I was inundated with an immense personal sense of grief and remorse that so many lives were wasted during the time of the war. I felt the same way after visiting the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington."
